Drug Class:

Indications and Uses:

Doses and Administration:

- Monitor blood counts regularly during prolonged use to avoid potential hematological effects.

- Avoid high tyramine-containing foods (e.g., aged cheese, fermented products) during treatment to prevent hypertensive episodes.
- Use with caution in patients with a history of seizures or neurological disorders.

Drug Interactions:

- Inform your doctor if you are taking serotonergic drugs (e.g., SSRIs, MAO inhibitors) as these may increase the risk of serotonin syndrome.
- Avoid concurrent use with decongestants, vasopressors, or dopaminergic agents.
